During the Barons & Builders day camp at the Railroad Museum of

Pennsylvania, your child will examine how railroads have played—and continue to play—a major role in the transportation of people and things across America and around the world.

Campers will engage in a number of hands-on activities that explore how railroading was developed through science and technology, how it has impacted our arts and culture and how it has shaped our history.

Opened to the public in 1975, the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania is one of the top railroad museums in the world. The collection includes more than 100 pieces of rolling stock equipment, in addition to thousands of other artifacts, documents and photographs. The Museum building is 100,000 square feet, or approximately the size of three football fields.

CAMP SPECIFICS

The cost per day camper is:

- \$125.00 for Friends of the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania members.
- \$175.00 for non members.

Registration is open to children ages 9 to 12. Camp sessions are divided into two age groups: Week 1 is for 9 and 10-year-olds; Week 2 is for 11 and 12-year-olds. Hours are 10:00 am to 3:00 pm daily, except for the designated train trip day.

Participation is limited to 15 campers per session. Families will receive written confirmation of enrollment after their registration form is received by the Museum.
