ITINERARY

Tuesday, June 13, 2023:

5:30AM: Motorcoach will depart from Lancaster, Penn Cinema, 541 Airport Rd.

6:30AM: Depart from Harrisburg, AAA Central Penn, 2301 Paxton Church Rd; travel to Pittsburgh with appropriate rest stop en route.

***Departure times are approximate and will be confirmed closer to travel.*

Enjoy an included lunch in Pittsburgh before taking a ride on the Monongahela Incline. Take the incline from Station Square up 600 feet to the top of Mt. Washington to experience spectacular views of downtown that few cities can offer. This afternoon, continue onward by motorcoach to Independence, OH, and to your hotel for the next two nights. Dinner this evening is on your own.

Hotel: Holiday Inn Independence, Independence, OH (Lunch)

Wednesday, June 14, 2023:

This morning, depart for Cleveland for a visit to the B & O Roundhouse in Cleveland. The Roundhouse was built at the turn of last century to accommodate Cleveland's expansive rail service. Today the building is the base of operations for the Midwest Railway Preservation Society. It services locomotives, used much in the same manner, although the facility is used for restoration work rather than daily maintenance. Next travel to Berea for lunch at the "Berea Depot". Built as the Union Depot in 1876, it played an important role in the economic development of Berea for approximately 75 years. The station was closed for passengers in 1931 but was later modified somewhat by freight delivery companies. In 1975, local businessmen purchased and remodeled it as a restaurant. After lunch, continue onward to Bellevue for a visit to the Mad River and NKP Railroad Museum. At the entrance to the museum, you'll find a Watchman's Tower and a Sections House, which is now a gift shop. Inside, you can relive all aspects of railroading, from the cupola of a caboose to a telegrapher's desk. Then enjoy an included dinner before traveling to Wellington for a roundtrip ride on the Lorain & West Virginia Railroad, operated by the Lake Shore Railroad Association.

Hotel: Holiday Inn Independence, Independence, OH (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

Thursday, June 15, 2023:

The first stop of the day is Rockside Station to board the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad. Enjoy a nostalgic train ride along miles of track, through the heart of the Cuyahoga National Recreation Area. You will travel in vintage climate-controlled coaches that offer you a picture window view of the park's natural beauty, and historic sites. Then depart for Sugarcreek with a lunch stop enroute. (*lunch not included*). Visit the Age of Steam Roundhouse, the "first full-sized, working roundhouse built in the U.S. since 1951." The goals of the Roundhouse and Museum are: 1) to preserve the steam locomotives, historic diesels, passenger cars and other railroad relics from the collection of founder, Jerry Joe Jacobson. 2) to operate a full-scale, operating, and realistic roundhouse and back shop to overhaul, repair and maintain Jerry's rolling stock. 3) to run the steam locomotives on freight trains. 4) to display railroad heritage for future generations. Drive to your hotel for the evening and check in with some time to freshen up before dinner. Depart the hotel and travel to Ernest Warther Museum & Gardens. Earnest "Mooney" Warther is best known for his ivory and ebony carvings of steam engines, which were appraised by the Smithsonian as "Priceless Works of Art". On the guided tour, guests will see these carvings created out of wood, ivory, and pearl - from entire trains (including Lincoln's Funeral Train) to a hand carved steel mill. Visit Mrs. Warther's Swiss Garden and Button house, the original Family Home, and one of the areas' finest gift shops. Dinner is included in the Ivory Room.

Hotel: Holiday Inn Express, New Philadelphia, OH (Breakfast, Dinner)

Friday, June 16, 2023:

After checking out of the hotel, depart for Dennison to visit the Dennison Railroad Depot Museum. The Dennison Depot Servicemen's Canteen operated from 1942 to 1946. A million and a half G.I.s were served free food, coffee, and smiles by 3,987 volunteers from eight counties at the Dennison Depot Salvation Army Servicemen's Canteen. The Canteen operated around the clock, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, providing a great boost to the home front effort and earning the town the nickname "Dreamsville, USA". Lunch is included at the Dennison Railroad Depot before departing. As you travel towards Central PA, visit the PA Trolley Museum for a trolley ride and a tour. Following the PA Trolley Museum, re-board the coach and return to central Pennsylvania with a fast food dinner stop (not included) enroute. (Breakfast and Lunch)
